







on the futures of our children

In my address to the Schools United Rally in Dublin last December I stated that we would “let all political parties know that when they come before the electorate that there would be a heavy political price to be paid for sacrificing our children’s future”.

When deciding which way we vote we consider the public good, what is best for our communities and what best serves our country as a whole. A commitment by candidates and political parties to the retention of a quality education system should be a vital component in making the decision. The indiscriminate cuts to the education system announced in October’s budget and the moratorium on the filling of essential management posts in schools and colleges announced in March will have a devastating effect on a system that is already clearly under-funded.

The opportunities denied to our children cannot be restored next year or the following year. Each child’s opportunity comes only once, and the educational opportunity of today’s children is being seriously damaged. Our children cannot wait until the economy recovers from the damage done by this government’s ineptitude.

Despite the magnitude of the damage done to it over the past nine months our education system faces even greater challenges in the coming year. The retention of teachers and lecturers essential to the education system must be a priority. There must also be a commitment to invest now in building new skills that will put us in the strongest possible position as the economy recovers. Skills to support the development of new industries and services will determine whether we are ready

to gain competitive advantage when economic growth resumes.

As a first step in our opposition to any move to further asset-strip the system and to ensure adequate investment in the re-skilling of the new un-employed we must ensure that for the forthcoming elections we lend our support only to those candidates who give an unequivocal undertaking to protect and support the education system and especially those most vulnerable and disadvantaged in our communities.

## TO: Each Candidate in all Local Elections / European Elections / Dáil Bye-Elections

14th May 2009

Dear Candidate,

You will be aware that the Government has over the past year introduced a number of significant cuts in overall education spending. TUI believes that these Budget cuts will have a disproportionate effect on the more disadvantaged in our society. Regrettably, the disadvantaged are the least able to cope with any reduction in the level of education provision or with additional costs being imposed on them. They will inevitably suffer the most in the short term and in the long term as a consequence of the cutbacks.

In your capacity as a Candidate for the forthcoming election, I wish to put to you a number of questions, (see attached) and

I would appreciate your response to them no later than 12 noon on Tuesday 19th May 2009. The questions are short and I believe all are amenable to a straightforward “yes” or “no” answer. I would ask that you respond in this manner.

It is the intention of the Union to publicise amongst its membership the responses to the questions and to ask our members to take these views into account when casting their vote in the forthcoming elections on 5th June 2009.

I enclose, for your information, a list of the cutbacks in education made in the 2008/09 budgets, which will have an extremely negative effect on the level of and overall quality of service provision at all levels of education.

Authorities such as the OECD have expressed the view that spending on education should be regarded as an investment. It follows, therefore, that education should be exempt from cutbacks in spending, even in the grim financial circumstances in which Ireland now finds itself. Many others share this view with the TUI.

We are talking about the service available to the young people and adult learners of the nation. We are not talking about the pay and conditions of teachers.

I look forward to receiving your response prior to 12noon on Tuesday 19th May 2009.

**In order to highlight the unacceptable cutbacks in education, TUI sent a short questionnaire to candidates in the forthcoming European, local and bye elections in Dublin South and Dublin Central.**

The union found it very difficult to obtain the email addresses of non party and independent candidates, as there is no requirement for candidates to give their email addresses to the returning officers.
